

## Bombay

Ship: 937 tons

Captain: G Sellars

Surgeon Superintendent: Dr Matthews

Sailed London 26th August 1863 - arrived Auckland 8th December 1863

It is not generally known that the ship "Bombay" gave name to the settlement of Bombay situated about 47 kilometres (29 miles) south of Auckland. Most of the early settlers in this district came out from England aboard this ship making her first voyage to Auckland in 1863. The Bombay seldom had a fair chance when trading to New Zealand of showing what she was capable of doing, as on nearly all the voyages out she had the ill-luck to strike furious storms, either in the Channel or later. The Bombay was a full-rigged ship of 937 tons and flying the Shaw Savill flag. On the four voyages she made to the colony she was under the command of Captain G. Sellars, a fine old gentleman and a skilful sailor.

It is believed the migrants boated their way from Drury up a tributary of the Maketu Stream to a point where Chamberlain Road now crosses it, and a small waterfall blocked further passage. In the 1940's I was shown a metal ring fastened to a rock beneath the falls where boats reputedly moored. In the 1940's the stream rarely carried enough water for boats to navigate up the stream that high. – I.J.C.
